- Assist in transferring Indigenous Knowledge to our Nations through outreach (e.g. collaborative research; seminars; workshops; lectures; websites; publications) and, where applicable, through technology transfer (e.g. collaborative research; contract work; and commercialization of intellectual property).
- Assist and participate in cultural and special events and other duties as required from time-to-time.

- 1 to 2 years experience is preferred.
- Understanding of the TARR system and accessibility.
